2. 2110-04-02_ECHO Policy:

SUMMARY: ACMCA has proposed a change in the ACCD dispatching policy for ECHO level calls with the purpose of getting first responders trained in CPR moving towards the scene sooner than would otherwise occur due to the current need for the responding EMS agency to request assistance from the fire department – the auto dispatching of the jurisdictional fire department (non-EMS licensed).

RECOMMENDATION: Firefighters in MI are certified in CPR (including chest compressions and delivering artificial breaths), AED use, and choking first aid, ACMCA proposes the auto dispatching of the jurisdictional fire department (non-EMS licensed) with the dispatch change recommended to begin August 1, 2024 at 07:00.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Quarterly Report:

-Presented for questions to the Board by J. Ludwig.

2. VHF System and Outdoor Warning Siren Activation:

-The VHF system the County uses to activate the outdoor warning system has begun to fail. On June 7th siren test, none of the sirens in the Southeast quadrant of the County activated. It was determined by Tele-Rad that the Otsego Tower Site had lost GPS lock, and there were reported failures of equipment at multiple other sites discovered as Tele-Rad investigated over the following weeks. ACCD and Allegan County Emergency Management (ACEM) continue to work together to address this issue. On June 18, 2024 Tele-Rad served 90 notice that they will no longer maintain the County's VHF system as they find no path forward with the existing system due to the age of system and availability of replacement parts. ACEM's Armature Radio group is exploring options, and ACCD and ACEM are seeking information on Mass Notification Options, replacement/upgrades of the current VHF or transition to 800MHz activation up to and including moving to local activation of sirens.

-Jim Pitsch of Salem Township expressed his concerns regarding the VHF system, its impact on the outdoor warning system, and the need to ensure it continues to be supported, especially as it related to Sandy Pines.

-Point of Order called by Vice Chair R. Sarro to seek clarity of comment being made by J. Pitsch. Point of Order recognized by Chairman D. Kapenga. Chairman D. Kapenga stated that the meeting was still in the discussion phase and then asked J. Pitsch to conclude his comment.

-Motion to allow ACCD Director to approve the purchase of a mass notification system in addition to the VHF sirens currently in place, to the extent it exceeds \$50,000 but not to exceed \$100,00.00 made by R. Sarro. Supported by D. Haverdink. All in favor, motion carried.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS:

ROUND TABLE: -J. Gibson-iPhone crashes discussion of validity. M. Larsen stated that the Michigan Sheriffs Association is conducting a study.

- -R. Sarro suggested ACCD have Motorola come to the next meeting for questions. J. Ludwig will reach out.
- -M. Larsen stated the new encryption talk group is working well. W. Wisner will work on MOUs with the surrounding Counties to enable more interoperability.
- -H. Reinart expressed concern regarding the 800MHz system as it relates to paging. R. Sarro suggested a meeting be held separate from the Board Meeting to discuss those concerns further as they were not germane to policy, but operational in nature.
